IDENTIFICATION REQUIREMENTS

GPV Property is obliged to comply with all applicable anti-money laundering and counter-terrorism financing laws and regulations of Australia. To be accepted as an investor in a GPV Trust, under these laws, GPV Property is required to confirm the identity of investors. GPV Property may also be required to collect other information from investors to comply with AML/CTF laws and regulations from time to time.

REQUIREMENTS FOR INDIVIDUALS

If you are an individual investor or sole trader, you will need to provide us certified copies of one document from column [1] **OR** one document from each of column [2] AND column [3] in the table of options for individual identity verification presented below.

The certifier of the identification documents must include the following information on the certified copy:

- Their full name;
- Their address;
- Telephone number;
- The date of certifying;
- · Capacity in which they are eligible to certify; and
- An official stamp/seal if applicable.

To be an eligible certifier, the certifier must hold one of the roles specified in the table below.

REQUIREMENTS FOR NON-INDIVIDUAL INVESTORS

Different identification and verification requirements apply to prospective investors who are not individuals, such as companies, family trusts and superannuation funds, as set out below. For superannuation funds and other trusts, please note the requirements for identification of Trustees.

Australian Companies

- Identity details of all Directors, as per requirements for individuals; and
- Identity details of all Shareholders with a beneficial interest of 25% or greater of the company; and
- A certified copy of the certification of registration or licence or other records of the relevant commonwealth, state or territory statutory regulator.

Superannuation Funds

- Identity requirements of all beneficiaries as per requirements for individuals; and
- An extract from the government website (http://superfundlookup.gov.au/) showing the name of
 the fund and that the fund is a registered superannuation fund, or a certified copy of
 correspondence from the ATO providing verification of the registration of the superannuation fund.

Other Trusts (eg. Family trust)

- Identity requirements of all beneficiaries as per requirements for individuals; and
- To confirm the name of the Trust:
 - A certified copy or extract of the Trust Deed showing the name of the trust; or
 - A letter from a solicitor or qualified accountant that confirms the name of the trust; or
 - A notice issued to the trust by the Australian Taxation Office within the last 12 months.

Trustees of Super Funds and other Trusts

In addition to the identification requirements for superannuation funds and trusts, identification is required for the Trustees of those superannuation funds and trusts:

- Individual Trustee verification as per the identification requirements for an individual; or
- Australian Company Trustee verification as per the identification requirements for companies.
